3i's - Intent, implementation and **impact** are key things to think about when deciding activities and reason for activities in the nursery.

Stretch and challenge is an important element of differentiation, which is often considered just for those who are behind in their expected learning. This focuses on those most able to move onto their next steps and continue their accelerated development.

Characteristics of learning include:

- playing and exploring children investigate and experience things, and 'have a qo';
- active learning children concentrate and keep on trying if they encounter difficulties, and enjoy achievements;
- creating and thinking critically - children have and develop their own ideas, make links between ideas, and develop strategies for doing things.

Inclusion is a sense of belonging, feeling respected, valued for who you are and a level of supportive energy and commitment from others so that you can do your best work. Children who are included can be happy and engaged, this is when they do their best learning.
