Does your reputation fit?

This guidance will inform context-driven decisions to enhance the reputation of your setting. From taking over an existing setting, or recovering from a damaging Ofsted report or piece of public feedback, the primary aim must be on showcasing improvement, this document will help you to do just that.

Transparent communication

Proactively communicate with the community, parents, and other stakeholders, about the changes that have happened and the next steps. This can be done through newsletters, website updates, social media platforms, and meetings.

Highlight achievements

Emphasise the settings recent achievements and successes. This can include improved outcomes, recognition or awards received by children or staff or successful extracurricular programs.

Showcase USPs & initiatives

Be specific about what has changed to enhance the learning environment. This could include new curriculum offerings, updated facilities, investment in technology, or innovative teaching methods.

Get testimonials

Enourage current children and parents to share their positive experiences and testimonials about recent changes. Collect these in a format that can be easily shared widely with others.



Remember...

Consistency, transparency, and a genuine commitment to improvement are key when showcasing a settings positive changes and building trust in its new reputation.

Open house and tours

To allow prospective families, to visit the setting and see the positive changes for themself and interact with staff and children to get a sense of the improvements being made.

Community involvement

Actively engage with the local community. This can be by volunteering or partnering with community groups, or hosting educational events. This shows the commitment to being a positive force within the community.

Collaborate and partner

Collaborating and partnering with other reputable settings, businesses, or educational institutions can help enhance the settings reputation by association and demonstrate an important shift in mindset.

Parent engagement

Encourage parental to engage in setting activities. This can include regular meetings, workshops, and more that allow parents to contribute to the settings improvement and be invested in its success.

Long-term planning

Develop and communicate a clear, comprehensive long-term plan for further improvement and growth. This shows that the settings transformation is an ongoing process and that it is committed to continuous improvement.
